St. Anne Adult Recognition Award

The St. Anne Award for adults working with Catholic members of national organizations serving girls is an award of the Department of Education, United States Catholic Conference and was inaugurated at the Sixth National Conference of Catholic Youth Work, held in Philadelphia in November, 1957. It is offered to those in dioceses which choose to use it, subject to the approval of the local ordinary, as a national award for adults.

Saint Anne, the mother of the Virgin Mary, is a fitting and apt model for this, the highest award given by the Diocesan Catholic Committee on Scouting (DCCS) to persons who have given selflessly to Catholic members of girls' organizations. This award is given under the auspices of the National Federation of Catholic Youth Ministry and careful evaluation by the DCCS with the goal of being highly selective. This medal is not an award to be earned, but rather an honor one is nominated for by others. As such, all nominations should be made confidentially to the selection committee of the DCCS. The total number of St. Anne medals given in any calendar year will not exceed three. Nomination forms must be received by December 31. The medal is usually presented at an Adult Recognition Dinner, Bishop's Dinner or Scout Recognition Mass in the spring.

The Saint Anne medal may be given to any adult, lay or religious, Catholic or non-Catholic who has shown a consistent commitment to the spiritual formation and development of youth in girls' organizations. No posthumous or honorary recognitions are to be made. The following are general guidelines for appropriate candidates:

- Promotes the religious recognition programs for Catholic members and/or serves as a counselor. Encourages non-Catholic members to participate in the religious recognitions of their faith
- Gives notable service in promoting Catholic activities and service projects for the church and shows willingness to serve on like committees
- Participates actively in the adult spiritual motivation program retreats or days of recollection, and is instrumental in having others participate
- Gives outstanding service in promoting and participating in Girl Scout/Camp Fire Sunday observances
- Gives notable service in extending the national organization to more members under Catholic auspices
- Assists parishes and Catholic organizations in recruiting adults for key leadership positions
- Is fully trained in the skills of the organization and is outstanding for his/her sense of responsibility, humility, and good example
- Is responsible for Catholic members being transported to mass at camporees and summer camps and provides for spiritual needs of the no-Catholics within these groups;
- Creates a better understanding of the aims and ideals of the organizations by the clergy and laity through the Catholic press and other communications media
- Is instrumental in organizing and promoting these programs for all members regardless of race or creed and gives leadership
- Encourages the true spirit of ecumenism as well as parochial responsibility and Catholic leadership within the girls' organizations served, and
- Fosters good relationships with council and is capable of interpreting Catholic programs to council members
